The participation of research institutes and/or academic institutions is welcome as additional participants or subcontractors according to each country's funding regulations.	The France-Israel Industrial R&D Cooperation Framework (acronym FIRAD) promotes R&D collaboration between French and Israeli companies. The France-Israel R&D program provides support to qualifying applications. Each partner receives funding from their national funding bodies: ISERD for Israel, and Bpifrance for France, provided it meets their criteria for funding. The applicants have to demonstrate that the project will bring strong technological and commercial spillovers for both. Also, the collaboration must have a significant added-value and be fruitful for both entities. The companies must have the technological, commercial and financial capabilities to successfully bring the new product to market.

The Andrew W. Mellon Foundation supports a wide range of initiatives to strengthen the humanities, arts, higher education, and cultural heritage. Organizations in those fields can consult descriptions of the Foundation's areas of grantmaking to determine whether a project fits within the Foundation's programmatic interests and mission. Prospective grantees should review program area guidelines before inquiring about a particular project. If Foundation staff find that the project fits within the Foundation's grantmaking priorities, staff will invite a grant proposal. Once invited, grantees should be prepared to work closely with program staff in refining the proposal, often through multiple drafts. Based on the final proposal, program staff will determine whether to bring a grant recommendation to the Board of Trustees at one of its quarterly meetings (generally held in March, June, September, and December). The Foundation also invites and considers a limited number of grants in the amount of \$150,000 or less for approval by the Foundation's Officers ("Officers' Grants") between Board meetings.
